

Complete Streets Policies Improve

Street Safety and Health

We all want and deserve to live in safe, healthy communities. Complete Streets policies improve the way your community designs and builds streets and roads. Instead of prioritizing motor vehicles, neighborhoods would be designed and built for the safety of everyone including those who walk, bike, use a wheelchair, use public transportation, and drive.



Comprehensive Complete Streets policies:

- Establish a process for evaluating and addressing the needs of all users of all transportation projects, including new construction, reconstruction, and resurfacing.
- Require the implementing agency to adopt design standards based on best practices and work collaboratively with other agencies and the community.
- Embed equitable and inclusive community engagement in the process.
- Prioritize projects in neighborhoods with histories of systematic underinvestment.
- Make data publicly available, with special evaluation of the implementation in under-resourced communities.
